The fee is \$5 per day for multiple loads, or you can purchase a 5-day punch pass for \$20. You can purchase the punch pass at the facility or at the Town clerk's office. The facility is open on Saturdays from 10 AM to 1 PM.

American Legion Post 129 Memorial Day Celebration

The Memorial Day Celebration will be held on Monday, May 27, at noon at the Huntsville Cemetery. Since it is often difficult getting to the cemetery on Memorial Day, the Weber County Sheriff's Office Deputies (WCSO) will once again escort our residents and American Legion participants. The deputy led convoy to the Cemetery will depart Compass Rose Lodge at 11:45 am.

Here are the details:

11:30 – 11:40 - WCSO lead escort vehicle will line up on 200 South on north side of park heading west, just

east of the driveway entrance to the Compass Rose Lodge (CRL) (about 7430 E 200 S), so as not to block the CRL entrance. Huntsville residents, please line up and park along the curb behind the Sheriff's vehicle.

11:45 The American Legion volunteers/presenters convoy will arrive from Eden, and will line up on inside lane behind Sheriff vehicle. The Sheriff Deputy will start the procession. Please allow the American Legion convoy to go first, then the line of residents will join the convoy. Convoy continues West on 100 S and will bypass the toll gate and go into the cemetery.

The American Legion Post 129 always puts on an excellent and patriotic program. Let's honor and celebrate those who have sacrificed so much on our behalf.
