Skydiver's To Make A Special Delivery At 8 PM July 3rd

Huntsville is extremely fortunate to have Jump-master Blake Meibos and team Sky Dive into the Huntsville Park again this year thanks to the Weber County RAMP Grant.

As one of the top skydiving teams in the state, Blake's team was scheduled to jump into the Stadium of Fire prior to Carrie Underwood's performance.

As a favor to the residents of Huntsville, Blake's team gave up their stadium jump to return to Huntsville again this year. Blake will be delivering a special surprise to Huntsville during his arrival in the park (some may consider it a booby prize).

Jumping into our park is quite dicey as large trees and baseball backstops typically don't mix well with parachutes. Two years ago, Ralph Hansen approached Blake after the jump and said, "I had to meet the crazy guy in the Red chute." Many felt the same way.

At press time, it looks like the sky divers will be jumping from a King Air 90, which is turbine powered and a much larger plane than we have had in the past. The plane will depart Tooele, drop some skydivers over the Stadium of Fire in Provo, then make the 20 minute flight to Huntsville for the special delivery from 14,000 feet. Don't miss it!

NOTICE

Notice is hereby given that the Huntsville City Council and Weber County Commission will hold a public meeting Thursday July 29, 2010 at 7:00 p.m. The meeting will be held at the Huntsville Library, 131 South 7400 East Huntsville, Utah. Said meeting will be for Sunrise Engineering, Inc. and the Utah Division of Water Quality to outline the proceedings of a Study (Capital Facilities Plan) to be conducted to determine the feasibility of sewerage Huntsville and the surrounding County area. This meeting is to inform citizens of the proposed study contents, the timeline for completing the study, the purpose for the study, and to answer as many questions as possible. A second public meeting will be held later in the draft study

phase to present preliminary findings of the study and to gather public town. Out of this fund we pay for salt, sand, vehicle maintenance, equipment, snow plowing, and salaries. If there are any funds left, then we apply those funds to our roads.

With our toll booth in place we started to collect toward our own 1st street maintenance fund, with hope that American Land & Leisure would step up and do what was ethically right.

With this said, I am pleased to say that they have. Starting Monday June 28th our Huntsville Town Toll Booth will no longer be collecting road funds. At the entrance to the Forest Service recreational land where AL&L has their booth they will collect an additional \$1.00 per vehicle on our behalf to go towards 1st street maintenance. These funds will be collected through the remainder of their contract with the Forest Service which ends in 2013.

I can't even begin to tell you how pleased I am that we were able to work this out. I would like to thank the Town Council, our Attorney and Staff for helping us to reach our goal.

We would also like to thank all those who live and travel this road because of the impact it had on you. We appreciate your patience and understanding.

Huntsville Town looks forward to giving you a new 1st street in the future.

VETERAN MONUMENT

For Huntsville Cemetery

Huntsville Town wants to erect a monument to honor those who have served our country in the military. This monument would be placed in the Huntsville cemetery.

The monument design in consideration is a bronze casting atop a large block of stone, such as granite or marble. The bronze will be a cavalry man rider less horse, with head lowered, his body obviously tired in a pose of having given his all to the conflict and still bearing full battle gear. The total height of the monument is expected to be approximately seven feet tall. The height of the bronze sculpture would be approximately three feet of the total height represented.

The rider less horse in this setting powerfully represents a fallen soldier. The monument is intended to pay tribute to all past soldiers that have fought and died to preserve our freedoms whether on the battle field or after returning home from service and living out the rest of their lives.

A monument like this may seem expensive but the cost will be minor compared to the price paid by all those brave souls that have served this country, the United States of America, with their lives.

The exact amount of money that it will take to put this project together is not yet known. Some sculptors and foundries have been explored and the amount looks hefty. Along with the information so far gathered, some funding ideas have evolved that if

pursued could easily cover the cost of the monument.

Suggested Ideas for Funding

1 A miniature or small version of the large bronze could be cast in an edition of twenty or so and sold to businesses and individuals. This alone should cover most of the cost.

2 Steve Johnson is willing to donate a series of existing fine art prints to be sold to help cover costs.

3 Steve Johnson is also in the process of doing a painting of the same image, 'The Rider Less Horse' and copies of that may also be sold to help with costs.

Information and prints will be available at the Huntsville 4th of July celebration. Check at the main ticket booth in the ice skating shack.

We are excited to be part of this great endeavor to honor those who have served our country. We will begin fund raising now. We welcome all those who would like to donate.
