### Free insulation is available for your home...

Several residents in town have taken advantage of the free insulation program over the last couple of years, and we understand the program expires in 2010.

Rocky Mountain Power and Questar Gas both offer a rebate program that will likely cover the entire cost of insulation.

Mayor Truett recently used Utah Energy Savers and was very pleased with their work.

Gail Ahlstrom had her home insulated last year and was actually paid to have her home insulated.

Gail states, "I did the insulation rebate last year and put the notice in the town newsletter. There were five people who took advantage of this last year."

She goes on to offer this caution, "I did **not** sign over the rebate papers to

the company that did the insulation. They put the insulation in for .37 cents a sq. foot for a cost of about \$500 for my home. I did all the paper work myself. I got rebated \$500 from Qwest and a few months later got my rebate of \$500 from Rocky Mtn Power, so I was paid \$500 to add insulation to my attic."

She continues, "When I originally looked at this program there were companies who would ask you to sign over the rebate to them and they charged you .75 cents a square foot and they kept the overage. It was a scam. I did some further research and found an honest provider and I got the rebate not the wholesaler of insulation. Buyer beware, everyone is out to make a profit at someone else's expense. Questar does have a list of reputable providers on their website."

There are many variables when comparing contractors, so make sure you are comparing apples to apples. Each may recommend a different type or depth of material. The easiest way may be to compare the number of bags (cubic feet) of insulation the contractor is proposing to install.
