### Firearms Discharged In Town Limits

On September 29th just before dusk, several neighbors in the vicinity of 400 S. and 7700 E. heard five gunshots. No one actually saw the shooter and no one admitted to firing a weapon, so the Weber County Sheriff's office was unable to make any arrests or issue any citations. The shots were possibly an attempt to scare or frighten small children and it is the second such incident near the location in the past 18 months.

Discharging of weapons in town is strictly prohibited and residents are urged to call 911 if they hear or observe any firearms being discharged in town. Parents are also urged to ensure the safety of their children in this neighborhood.

### Weed Eradication

Per the recently passed Weed Eradication resolution and our nuisance ordinance, our town tractor will be available during the next few weeks to mow and/or trim your weeds, pastures, etc. The fee, which includes both tractor and driver, is \$45 per hour with a one hour minimum. The minimum is simply to make it worthwhile to transport the tractor to your location and you are welcome to combine jobs with your neighbors if you wish. Most 3/4 acre lots can be mowed in 1 hour or less.

There is new legislation for elections that requires a two week early voting period. All early voting for Huntsville Town Residents will be held at the Huntsville Town Hall on the following dates and times:

October 20-23, Tuesday thru Friday, from 1:00 p.m. to 5:00 p.m.

October 27-30, Tuesday thru Friday, from 1:00 p.m. to 5:00 p.m.

General Elections for Huntsville Town residents will be held at the Huntsville Town Hall on November 3<sup>rd</sup>, 2009, polls will be open from 7:00 a.m. to 8:00 p.m.

Every registered voter is required to show "valid identification": a form of identification that bears the name and photograph of the voter.

For both methods include a photocopy of your driver's license or another form of picture identification with the registration form.

Must be postmarked by October 3<sup>rd</sup> to be registered for the upcoming election.
