Just to give everyone an update on the Valley School property. We have had many meetings with different parties in order to come to some type

of an agreement to secure the old school property to no avail so far. We will continue to pursue all avenues to do what's right for Huntsville Town on this matter. It appears that the Weber School Board wants to get rid of a potential liability. They got numerous bids to demolish the school and this was awarded to a contractor and will be carried out mid February. They want to put back into six building lots.

We are still negotiating with them to get the alley way back and to work something out to get two of the lots in front of the park.

We will keep you posted.

Our Town Council Meetings will remain on the first and third Thursdays at 7:00 P.M. of each month. We welcome all to attend and to be heard.

Huntsville Planning Commission News:

The Huntsville Planning Commission is starting off 2010 with some new faces and a full agenda of tasks to do. The commission welcomed Doug Allen, Ron Gault, and Rex Harris to the group at the January meeting. Chairman Ron Gault outlined the following goal for the next few months: the Huntsville Town General Plan will be updated to incorporate several new changes in state land use planning law, the potentials of annexation of several surrounding areas, and a Valley-wide sewer district being created, the adoption of a FEMA-validated flood plain map, and concepts for the soon-to-be-vacant land where the Valley school currently resides.

Meetings will be held more frequently than once a month during this time period and will be posted on the Town Email newsletter as well as the usual postings at the Town Hall and Post Office. All are welcome to bring their inputs and insights!

Rabies & Licensing Clinic

In addition to the previously scheduled Rabies and Licensing

clinics to be held at The Weber County Animal Shelter, a clinic has been scheduled in Huntsville for pet owners' dogs.

It will be held: **March 6, 2010**, 2:30 to 4:00 PM at the Huntsville Fire Station

Clinics will also be held from 2:00 to 4:00 p.m. at the Weber County Animal Shelter, located at 1373 North 750 West inside the North gate of the Weber County Fairgrounds.

February 6 & 20, 2010

Weber County Animal Services also sells and renews dog licenses. Cost of dog licenses:

Spayed or neutered pet: \$10

Non-spayed or neutered: \$25

Seniors price: \$5

A mandatory late fee (due 30 days after a license expires) is \$20 per household.

You can also renew your dog's license on line at www.co.weber.ut.us/animalshelter/animal_license.php

New procedures allow the Weber County licenses to be valid for 12 months from the date of licensing rather than expiring at the end of December each year.

Weber County and Huntsville ordinances require ALL dogs to be licensed annually and the dog must be tagged and collared.
